
Activity Information System

- A searchable global database with more than 600 water projects and 3,500 project-related documents
- A pool of learning materials and a platform currently hosting around 20 joint training activities of UN-Water members and partners
- A user-friendly interface for displaying, updating and exporting data
- An open source modular IT architecture

The UNW-AIS is a platform for UN-Water members, partners and programmes as well as a broader audience including policy makers, water professionals, researchers and those from higher education. Users can find information about water-related field projects and programmes, joint activities and learning initiatives, and share information and knowledge from global to local level. Two core components of UNW-AIS focus on projects and learning activities. Furthermore, a facilitated e-Learning course is being piloted in the "Virtual Learning Environment" of UNW-AIS.

A flexible, modular platform serving the needs of UN-Water

In 2010, UN-Water mandated UNW-DPC with the establishment of UNW-AIS. It expands the functionality of the earlier Capacity Development Information System (CDIS) in response to UN-Water members' and partners' needs for a UN-Water platform. It also contains various activity mappings conducted under the auspices of several UN-Water Task Forces and Thematic Priority Areas and the IW:Science project database. The content of the UNW-AIS is structured along UN-Water focus areas.

The information system can be used in many ways.

Examples include

- helping UN-Water Task Forces to identify gaps and potential synergies among projects
- enabling UN-Water to present an overview of activities of UN-Water members, partners and programmes
